The Researcher will be part of the Research and Insights team which sits within the Insights and Evaluation Group, which is committed to Māori and Pasifika health equity and the application of Te Tiriti o Waitangi to strengthen research and evaluative practice within a Crown entity context.

Accountabilities

- Undertake agreed research and evaluation projects to support programmes, activities, policy and planning undertaken by Te Hiringa Hauora.
- Contribute to agreed internal and external research projects, including scoping, planning and implementing projects.
- Develop and manage project plans for a range of small and medium-scale projects.
- Author and contribute to research and evaluation reports and other publications for dissemination to the public health sector.
- Ensure research findings are disseminated and communicated effectively to a wide range of stakeholders.
- Negotiate contracts with external providers for small-scale projects and help negotiate contracts for complex and large-scale projects.
- Help manage contracts to ensure milestones are met and quality standards adhered to.
- Provide research advice, peer review and mentoring to team members and colleagues across the organisation.
- Contribute actively to improving and documenting good practice processes for the Insights and Evaluation Team.

Leadership

- Regularly demonstrate a positive, open and collaborative manner when contributing to your team, group and Te Hiringa Hauora values and activities.
- Support Te Hiringa Hauora culture and values by demonstrating them in all dealings with stakeholders and other staff members.
- Share expertise and knowledge within your team, across wider group and Te Hiringa Hauora.
- Ensure the delivery of projects to agreed deadlines and meet reporting requirements against key accountabilities.

- Develop projects in partnership with internal and external stakeholders including key Māori,
 Pasifika and youth stakeholders.
- Deliver against Te Hiringa Hauora strategic frameworks Strategic Plan, Health Promotion Framework, and Rangahau Framework.

Essential skills and experience

- Relevant post graduate tertiary qualification. A background in public health, health promotion, Māori health or Pasifika health is desirable.
- Experience of using qualitative or quantitative research techniques and data analysis, research practice and principles. Hands-on statistical expertise and experience is desirable.
- Experience, knowledge and skills working with Māori and Pasifika communities.
- Experience in public health and/or in using kaupapa Māori or Pasifika research methodologies is desirable.
- Good written and oral communication skills and a demonstrated ability to write clear, wellstructured and meaningful academic reports.
- Ability to deliver research outputs on time and within budget.
- Good planning and organisational skills, including the ability to manage a range of tasks with conflicting priorities and the ability to manage risks and undertainty when required.
- Commitment to using te reo and tikanga Māori, and applying Te Tiriti o Waitangi principles in your work.



- Ability to build strong internal and external relationships in a complex, matrix style organisation.
- Have a 'can do' approach/attitude that will best achieve organisational aims.
- Experience of project management and administration is desirable.
